Surgeon Claiborne said that he wishes our men at the infirmary a quick recovery to swell the ranks of the brigade once more.

Another plague may be in sight, as our contacts with the United Kingdom have informed us. Their population in London have been suffering with similar symptoms and illness for the past month, with the illness spreading, it is unknown if this is Yellow Fever or Malaria. Surgeon Claiborne was uncertain as to how this will affect our war for liberty and our men in the field.

Ord.Serg'T Edwards has stated he hopes to pass on his knowledge and years of experience to aid our new Ordnance Sergeant Coers in his weapons apprenticeship. Congratulations to Ord.Serg'T Coers to his new position and to William Edwards for his long service to the Old Dominion!

The family was forced to turn back northward as the column of our infantry and cavalry encountered Unionist forces south of the city. Pray for our men and their families out in this conflict!

With new recruits coming into the ranks, our men have found themselves struggling with the bureaucratic machinery of the new army and the issuance of equipment and uniforms!

Since our Surgeon Claiborne has left for his duties to the Petersburg Army Hospital, our Regiment has been without a doctor to aid in the ails and wounds of our brave members. A newsletter requesting a new surgeon has been sent to the Richmond Times and other local dispatchers within our area.
